#### **Assessment Calendars**

We encourage our students to frequently check their calendars to stay informed of upcoming assessments. Study Skills Club will be held every Monday morning to further assist students with preparing for their assessments. All students are welcome to attend.

#### Year 12

Our Year 12 students have embarked on their final year at BCC with a conscientious and positive mindset. Students will have started their first internal assessment in many of their subjects which are due by Week 8. ### Dean's Corner - VET & Careers

This year, year 10s will complete the Short Course in Career Education. This subject has four pieces of assessment and will be run over the course of the year. At the end of the course, if students have completed and passed all four assessment tasks, they





will receive one QCE point. This will be carried over to year 11 and 12. Career Education focuses on personal attributes and how these skills can help with employment in the future. Students who are in year 11 and 12, who have not completed the Short Course, are encouraged to talk with me as they are still eligible to complete the course and obtain the QCE point.

TAFE has started back on Tuesdays this year. Students attending TAFE at the Home Hill campus are expected to attend CARE class first to have their names

marked off and then go to the bus bay for collection, unless prior transportation arrangements have been negotiated with myself and the office. When at TAFE, students have the option of bringing their own lunches from home, or purchasing food on the campus. TAFE concludes at 2:30pm so that students are back at the College by 3pm for pick up.

If students are looking to complete a traineeship, apprenticeship or any certificate courses outside of school, they are encouraged to come speak with me. I am more than happy to help out wherever I can. Also, students should listen to daily notices as I will be posting about employment and certificate opportunities when available. If any take their fancy, they will need to let me know.

## <u>Teaching & Learning Coordinator</u>

LAPTOPS: As technology continues to play a significant role in the educational landscape, laptops have become an essential tool for students and teachers alike. Laptops provide students with access to a wealth of information and resources that can enhance their learning experience, making them an invaluable asset in the classroom.

Many students have received their laptops. Students and their parents/guardians/carers need to head to the office to sign the relevant paperwork and pay the insurance fee of \$100. This payment can be completed in the office or a payment plan can be organised with the College.

It is important that these laptops are used appropriately. Student laptops are monitored, and any inappropriate websites or materials found on these school devices will lead to confiscation or outside authorities being contacted. All these details can be found in the BCC Digital Technology Agreement that all students and parents/guardians/carers have signed. If you have any questions regarding this, feel free to contact the office.

#### **NAPLAN Online:**

NAPLAN (National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy) is a standardised national assessment program that tests the literacy and numeracy skills of students in Australia. It is designed to provide a snapshot of student performance in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9 and to assist schools, educators, and parents in understanding the progress of students' learning.

Burdekin Christian College 2022 NAPLAN test was conducted online for the first time, moving away from the traditional pen-and-paper format. In 2023, NAPLAN Online will take place in March, much earlier than in previous years. With this date fast approaching, the school is doing everything it can to make sure our resources and students are prepared for these tests. 
